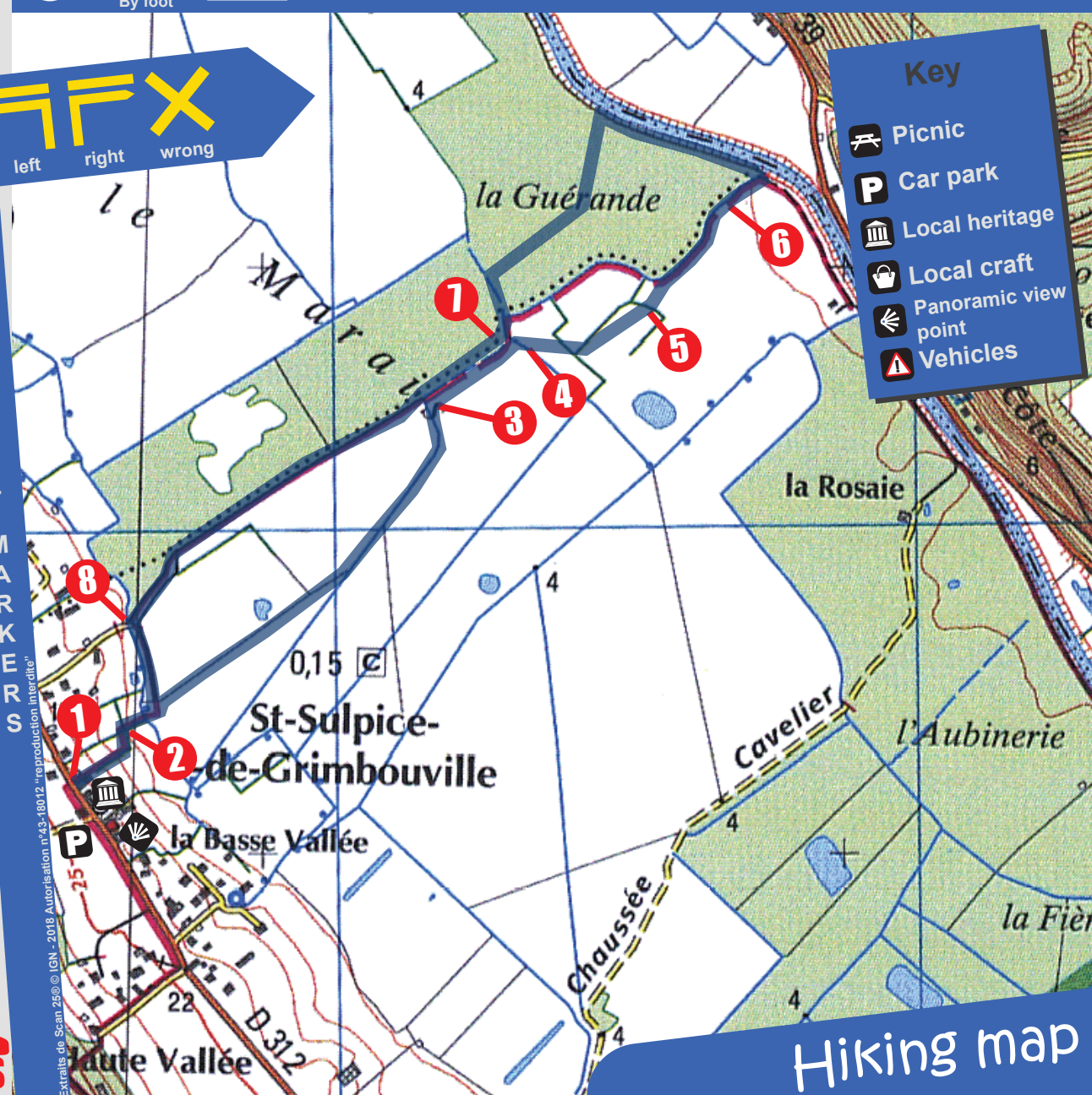

Stork nests, sources, marsh ditches, educational ponds and panels explaining the fauna, flora and landscapes.

- 1 Back to the car park, cross the RD 312 and go around the medieval house. After admiring the panorama from the orientation table, go down the path on your right towards the springs.
- 2 Cross the bridge to the marshes. At the first intersection, turn right onto the grass path which offers a wide view of the valley.
- 3 After crossing the grasslands, take the path on your right.
- 4 reaching the agricultural baffles (allowing the passage of cattle), continue straight ahead. In case of flood, possibility to cut through the bridge to the left.
- 5 Continue to cross the meadows, cross 2 other bridges and cross the wood.
- 6 On the banks of the Risle, turn left to follow the old towpath. After observing the level tide of the Risle, turn left again to step over the old bed of the Risle on a wooden walkway.
- 7 After the woods and the reeds, take the path along the ditch straight and observe a nest of storks.
- 8 After crossing the ditch, keep going along it. At the barrier marking the technical access of the marsh, turn left to find the gateway, then go straight to the church and its classified yew to discover the panorama of the valley from a different angle and continue to discover the heritage.
