PARC DES ENCLOS CALOUSTE GULBENKIAN, A GARDEN AS I WANT IT TO BE

Chemin des Enclos in Bénerville-sur-Mer

This extraordinary park, situated on the 33-ha Enclos domain, hosts rare plants and combines different atmospheres favouring meditation and relaxation, as its designer wished. Calouste Gulbekian, aesthete and businessman, acquired the "Domaine des Enclos" in 1937. At the time, there was just a house surrounded by a large park sunk into oblivion. He wanted to create here the garden he was dreaming of and entrusted Achille Duchêne to carry out this project.

The park combines the French classic-style gardens with geometrically disposed flower beds, the most irregular design of English gardens and Italian-style gardens with shaped yews and balustrades. Calouste Gulbenkian died in 1955 at the age of 86. The Parc des Enclos was managed by the Fondation Gulbenkian and donated to the City of Deauville in 1973.

"My desire is creating great harmony, excluding all small size objects, too common in style gardens (....) preserving its romantic soul and emphasizing it, decorating it without exaggerating.".

Access: Follow the "Chemin des Enclos" from the church of Bénerville-sur-Mer. Parking on the grass in front of the park entrance.









In the middle of nature

THE MARSHES OF BLONVILLE-VILLERS: ECOLOGICAL RICHNESS

The 120-ha marshes of Blonville-Villers consisting of wet grasslands, canals and ditches are classified as "Zone Naturelle d'Intérêt Faunistique et Floristique". Though being close to the sea, it is a freshwater marsh fed by the water courses coming from the surrounding hillsides. This sensitive natural area is partially (about 40 ha) protected by the Conservatoire du littoral. The marshes have a varied fauna and flora. In the wet grasslands, hydrophytes plants (surviving to prolonged flooding) like phragmites, rushes and sedges are found. This "relaxing" environment shelters and nourishes over 150 species of birds that permanently live here or just pass by. The top of two poplars has been adjusted to favour storks' nesting. Nationally protected species of amphibians and reptiles are also found.

In Villers-sur-mer, playgrounds, benches, petanque grounds, a trail to discover fauna and flora and a 5-km furnished path welcome strollers and riders.

The Paléospace - Museum of France offers marsh-discovery tours awakening your senses, trips in the nature and birdwatching strolls. See www.indeauville.fr

PARC DES GRAVES EXTENDS FROM THE TOP OF THE CLIFF TO THE SEA

Coastal route in Villerville

Enjoy this area that spreads from the top of the Roches Noires cliffs (see box below) to the sea and discover 800 m of pedestrian paths, one of them directly leading to the beach, a playground and a belvedere with a view on the sea. A remarkable fauna and flora are found: rare plants (sea kale, annual beard grass, stinking hellebore), wild plant species, remnants of ornamental gardens of olden times, as well as recent flower beds and ponds. A pond surrounded by trees hosts ducks and moorhens. It welcomes ducks and moorhens, but also sheep and goats, called "chèvres des

fosses". They are nicknamed "bramble crunchers" for their ability to eat all kinds of plants.

Under the Parc des Graves:
The Roches Noires cliffs
are 60-m-high cliffs stretching
for 4 km along the coast between
Trouville-sur-Mer and Villerville.
Called "Black Rocks", these
cliffs are partially classified as
"Environmentally Sensitive Area".
They constitute an excellent
natural cut of the geological
formations - the oldest date back
to the Late Jurassic period (160
million years ago)-.

Access: from the beach of Villerville (check sea tides).



MONT-CANISY, A NATURAL PLACE FULL OF HISTORY

Rue du Canisy in Bénerville-sur-Mer

The 110-m-high Mont-Canisy offers a breath-taking view that overlooks the "Côte Fleurie". The Mont-Canisy has been a seigniorial domain for centuries and is today a natural site protected by the Conservatoire du littoral and managed by the Conseil Départemental, which preserves its flora and fauna. It hosts over 200 species of plants, half of which are Mediterranean or mountain plants (juniper, dyer's greenweed...) and many regionally protected species (Chiltern gentian, Vincetoxicum and round-headed rampion). It's an oasis of orchids, with the fullest blooms of 13 species occurring from April to July. The park hosts 3 species of regionally protected birds (nightingale, grasshopper warbler and melodious warbler), several families of butterflies and a nationally protected snake: the Queen snake. Military facilities and natural caves favour the presence of bats.


Mont-Canisy: a historic site

The strategic position of the Mont-Canisy, situated on the valley facing the Seine Bay, led it to be transformed into a coast artillery position:

Pillboxes and cannon tanks, shelterbunkers, protecting tobruks, shot direction post... as well as a unique underground structure on more than 150 m of coast placed 15 m under the ground, are the vestiges of that time...

Guided visits are organized by the Amis du Mont-Canisy.

Access: In front of the church of Bénerville-sur-Mer, follow "Batteries du Mont-Canisy" (take the

Chemin du Mont-Canisy from Rue de Touques).

Park your car in the surroundings of the gate

and reach the panoramic viewpoint on foot (250 m).

Another access: Chemin de la Fontaine Marie (from the Chemin des Enclos)



THE CALL OF THE SAINT-GATIEN-DES-BOIS FOREST

in Saint-Gatien-des-Bois

It covers 3500 ha and is the largest forest in Calvados. It was originally called "Touques forest" and had many owners throughout the centuries. It was a royal domain, it belonged to nobles (Louise de Bourbon, Mlle de Montpensier...) and was broken up and sold to several buyers. It was used by brioleurs transporting logs, bundle of sticks or ferns. Their workmates were «mazette» horses; small horses equipped with a small bell to be easily found at night. Ulrich Güttinger, Swiss writer, had a private wooden chalet that represented for him the oasis he was longing for. He often welcomed here the greatest names of literature and art of his time: Victor and Adèle Hugo, Alfred de Musset, Alexandre Dumas, Gustave Flaubert, Charles Baudelaire, Théophile Gautier, Frédéric Chopin... Today, this forest has several owners, who exploit it to produce wood or as a hunting domain. Before the Revolution, wolves, stags, roe deer, fallow deer and wild boars could be easily seen. Nowadays, only foxes, hares and rabbits may be found here. Roe deer, wild boars and woodcocks live here in winter. Take the 9.5-km hiking trail, accessible out of the hunting period, to discover part of it!

ECOLOGY AT THE HEART OF THE ÉCO-DOMAINE DE BOUQUETÔT

Chemin des Broches in Saint-Pierre-Azif

The domaine de Bouquetôt, covering 68 ha, is a large former breeding farm that bears evidence to the rural life and the Pays d'Auge heritage of the 17th and 18th centuries. The seven buildings, typical of the traditional half-timbering architecture, are scattered in a tree-filled meadow. The eco-domaine is since 2009 a benchmark in the innovative development of natural resources. The objective is enhancing lands and farms setting up ecological, economic and pedagogical activities. A shared garden and a bakehouse, an organic cattle farm, tree houses, a spirulina production area are found here.

A wide range of teaching activities are organized around aromatherapy, spirulina cultivation, natural beekeeping, permaculture, edible plants, but also walking tours in the nature and a paper chase.

PARC DES RIVES AND PHOTOS

Quai de la Touques in Deauville

A green area was created along the Touques river with due respect for the surrounding natural environment. You can choose among two paths: the former is punctuated with a selection of Deauville images taken by the photographers invited every year to the Planche(s) Contact Festival; the latter explores vegetation through a 99-m ekki wood landing stage.

The Walk also continues to the other side, heading to the town of Touques.

THE GREENWAY ON FOOT, BY BIKE OR ON HORSEBACK

Between Deauville and Saint-Arnoult

The greenway covers 3.2 km from the city centre of Deauville to that of Saint-Arnoult. Walkers and sportsmen like striding along or driving on this pedestrian walk that crosses some of the main inDeauville leisure places: it stretches along the long straight track of the Deauville-La Touques racecourse, the local Parc de loisirs, the turf tennis fields of the Lawn Tennis Club Deauville Nomandie, the Longines Deauville International Equestrian Complex and follows the banks of the Boucles de la Touques to let you enjoy the view of ducks and swans.

BOUCLES DE LA TOUQUES AND LOCAL FAUNA

Avenue Michel d'Ornano in Saint-Arnoult

The La Touques river, flowing into the sea in Deauville/Trouville-sur-Mer, was displaced in the 1860s to construct the railway line coming from Paris. The irregular course of the river was adjusted to avoid building a bridge and the meander currently known as "la rivière morte de la Touques" progressively abandoned. The pedestrian-only banks are great to recharge your batteries in the middle of nature. You can relax on a bench, play petanque or just enjoy the children's playground. Fishing-lovers can enjoy the view of ducks and swans, but also fish carps, as this activity is permitted.











PARC SAN CARLO AND BRIDGES

Route de Dives in Villers-sur-Mer

This oasis of nature, covering more than 600 m on the heights of Villers- sur-Mer, is a vestige of the great domain that belonged to the Béarn Countess until its death in 1929 and invites to a nice shady walk that crosses several small bridges over the San Carlo stream.

THE MONTCEL STREAM PATH AND ITS WATERFALL

Avenue de la Brigade Piron in Villers-sur-Mer

This path stretches for 2 km along the Montcel stream up to the marshes of Blonville-Villers. Try not to miss trout that may appear after a bend or at the bottom of a small waterfall! Two small wooden bridges have been added to cross the stream. The path is bordered by a drop on the left Free access to the Montcel stream and a hill on the right. This topography favours the stream flowing into the marshes and the water Access: from Avenue de la Brigade environment.



Boulevard Cornuché in Deauville

LOCAL LEISURE PARK, HOT SPOT OF **COLLECTIVE SPORTS**

Chemin de la Briqueterie 14800 Touques

The leisure park is an 11-ha landscaped park. It was designed in an environmental strategy aimed at preserving the existing biotope (several amphibians and birds nest in the most humid areas of the park) and planting a high amount of plant species considered typical of the pond (various species of trees and reedbeds). It is a nature-watching, fishing, walking and relaxing place, including playgrounds and sports fields: three grass football fields, two synthetic turf fields, a children's playground, petangue areas, a 1-km fitness trail, a skating and cycling track for children


Squares and gardens
